Hampton Utilities

For after-hour emergencies or to report a power outage, please call 402-725-3186. Your call will be forwarded to a call center.



Severe Storm Season

The Hampton Fire Dept. will sound the sirens for an “All Outdoor Warning” which includes the following hazards: Nat’l Weather Service tornado warning, sighting of tornado or funnel cloud, straight winds in excess of 80 mph, and hail of 2.75” in diameter or larger. If you live in a home without a basement, you are encouraged to take shelter at the Hampton Fire Hall, 110 3rd Street, 402-725-3282.

Streets

If you are having construction work done at your residence, please refrain from parking dumpsters and roll-offs on city streets. There is an Ordinance that vehicles are not to be parked more than 24 hours on a Village street. If any resident in Hampton is considering closing a street for a function, you will need to complete an application requesting to close the street. The request needs to be approved by the Board at their regular meeting.



Dogs

Dog licenses are due in May. Dogs housed within the city limits need to be licensed. Fees are females \$5 and males \$3. Please provide a copy of your dog’s updated Rabies vaccination at the time of licensing.

City Dump

The city dump is open seven days a week. Items accepted are tree limbs, leaves, grass clippings, garden waste, and concrete. **Please-no plastic bottles, plastic bags, or lumber.** An iron dumpster is also available to dispose of metal items.

Sewer Issues

If you are experiencing sewer issues, the Board encourages you to call the Village as your first contact. We can ensure the Village’s sewer lines are working properly.



Mowing

When mowing please refrain from blowing grass clippings into the street. This can cause serious problems with the storm sewers. They can plug up during heavy rains causing water to back up in the streets. A reminder that property owners are responsible

to keep their properties mowed. If the grass gets over 12”, letters will be mailed addressing this matter. If no action is taken and the Village does the mowing, the Village will charge \$100/mowing.
